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School-Based Wellness Centers



In collaboration with Pueblo City Schools and Parkview Medical Center, PCHC began delivering services to school-aged children through School-Based Wellness Centers (SBWCs) located at Central High, East High, Freed Middle and Risley Middle schools. In 2010, we provided 5,004 visits for children during our first school year operating the SBWCs. The primary goal of the SBWCs is to provide quality services and improve access for school-aged youth in order to improve their health and wellness. In addition, SBWC services...

- ...keep students in school and parents at work.
- ...help families ensure their children are healthy.
- ...improve opportunities for families to receive needed services.
- ...improve students' performance and test scores.
- ...reduce absenteeism.
- ...avoid delays in treatment.
- ...allow students to experience high quality education.
- ...minimize school day distractions.



Accomplishments 2010



- We served 22,037 patients, 5% more people than in 2009.
- We provided 103,936 medical, dental and mental health visits.
- We delivered a record number of babies—548—which is 1 out of every 4 babies born in Pueblo County.
- We provided 5,004 visits for children at Central High, East High, Freed Middle and Risely Middle School-based Wellness Centers (SBWC) during our first school year operating the SBWCs.
- Our Foundation secured more than \$3.1 million from individuals, businesses and other entities for capital expansion needs.
- Our patients remain satisfied with their overall care and 98% would recommend PCHC to others.
- We served with distinction by following our Core Values and they remain vital to our success.

Growth

- We must fulfill our mission by embracing our core values and provide a primary care home for 1,200 more patients.
- We must actively manage our practice size to assure high levels of quality, access and customer service.
- We must complete the 110 Routt Avenue building renovation and re-open it with a larger pharmacy.
- We must assure our homeless, farmworker and HIV+ patients can access care and are served.
- We must find a way to fund our dental clinic expansion.
- We must achieve Accreditation Association Ambulatory Health Care re-accreditation.

Electronic Health Records

- We must begin the planning to implement NextGen electronic health records.
- We must learn how to and participate in electronic exchange of health information in our community.
- We must provide access to email, internet and the local area network to 100% of our employees.

Sustainability

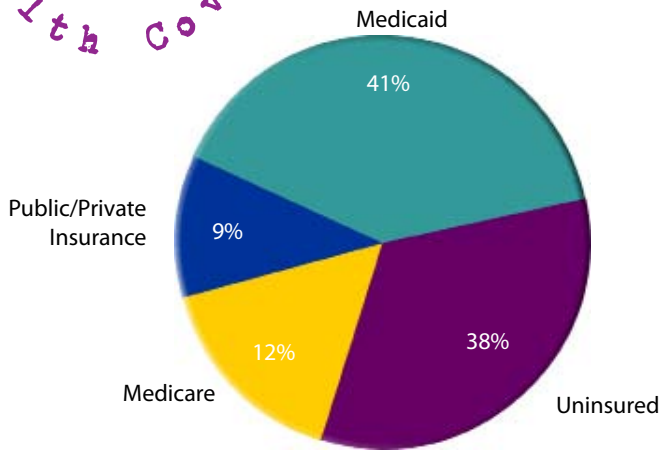
- We must recruit and retain providers and staff committed to our mission.

Strategic Partnerships

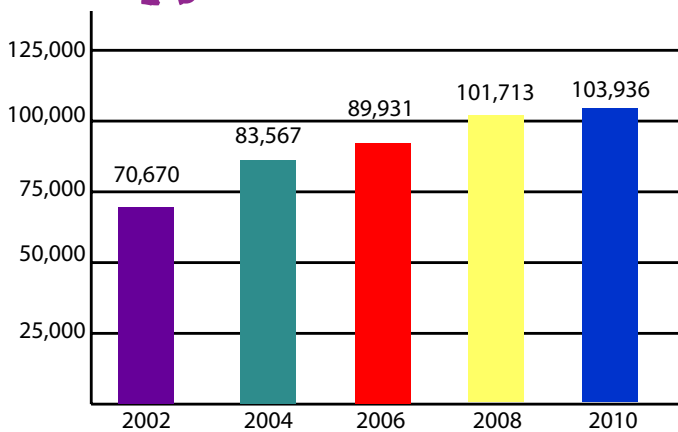
- We must continue to advocate on behalf of people who lack access to quality primary health care.

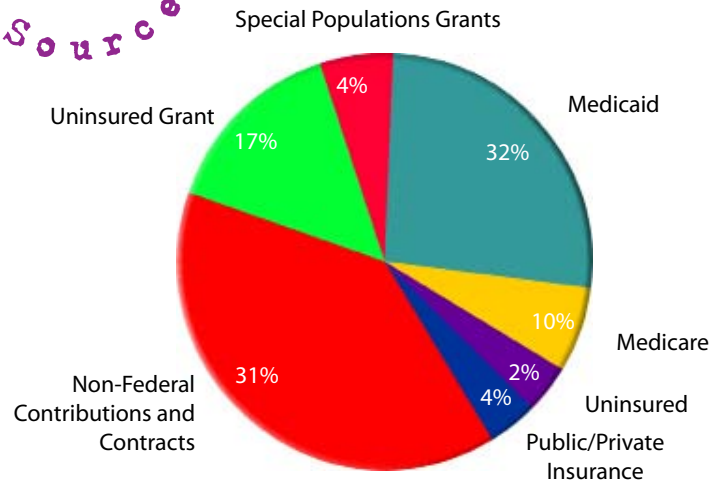

Dear PCHC Foundation Supporters,

Throughout 2010, we have had many opportunities to see the fruits of our efforts to bring high quality health care to even more Pueblo residents. PCHC's new three-story medical center opened in November 2009 and, as promised, we significantly reduced the waiting list; in fact, more than 1,000 people were removed from the list! We didn't make hollow "campaign promises" while securing \$3.1 million from caring businesses and individuals like you; rather, we promised to add 6,000 more people to our practice by the year 2015, and we are on track to meet this goal!

The new building's design complements the neighborhood's historic components, and many environmental elements were included to maximize energy efficiency. In fact, PCHC now boasts one of the largest privately owned solar panel systems in Southeastern Colorado! Also, to honor the devout members of St. Paul United Methodist Church for their 100+ year history before we built the new clinic on this location, we incorporated limestone from the church into Colorado Avenue Clinic's design: the first floor window archways showcase the limestone keystones, and the main sign rests on a solid foundation of this limestone, as well.

As you have seen through the pages of this Annual Report, 2010 was an amazing year for PCHC and PCHC Foundation. Never in the 27-year history of PCHC have we experienced such a surge of growth and such successful preparation for the future!

It is difficult to find the words to accurately convey our appreciation of your commitment, dedication, and support as we strive to care for even more people in need of primary health care services.
